


Allow the federal government to negotiate with drug companies to get a lower price on medications that would apply to both Medicare and private insurance




Lower the Medicare eligibility age to 60.



A large bipartisan majority supports Republican plurality for low-income Expand home health services and support for direct care workers




Fill the Medicaid gap, by providing health insurance to those who would be covered by Medicaid had their state expanded it.


Extend the increased ACA subsidies which lowers premiums and deductibles.


ACA Subsidies


Provide tax credits for clean energy production and energy-efficiency improvements.

Large bipartisan majorities support


Clean Energy Tax Credits

For cost of clean energy producing equipment: up to 30%




For electricity produced with clean energy: 5-10% of the average retail price


Establish a Civilian Climate Corps that would work on conservation, climate resilience and environmental justice projects.

Large bipartisan majorities support similar proposal.

Re-Establish Civilian Conservation Corps

ENVIRONMENT

Re-establish the Civilian Conservation Corps, which would employ workers to protect natural ecosystems, plant trees in rural & urban areas, and restore soil on farmlands



Community Projects Program

ENVIRONMENT

Implementing, or having ready to go in the event of an economic downturn, a community projects program dedicated to reclaiming land affected by pollution, improving energy efficiency, or renovating older public buildings, that would employ 750,000 people at a cost of \$30 billion a year.

Increase the supply of electric vehicles, in part through providing tax credits.

Bipartisan majority supports for electric buses


Large majority supports for electric cars

Tax Credit for Electric Buses


Tax credit for manufacturers of fully electric buses, equal to 10% of the sales price of each bus sold



Tax Credit for New Electric Cars

ENVIRONMENT


For the purchase of a new electric car, a tax credit of up to \$7,500

ENVIRONMENT


For people making under \$30,000, a tax credit of \$5,000 for the purchase of a used electric car


PROPOSAL & SUMMARY

Extend the Child Tax Credit reforms, which increased the amount of the credit, and made them fully refundable.

Republicans divided or plurality support

FAMILIES & CHILDREN

PROPOSAL & SUMMARY

Provide all workers with 12 weeks of family and medical leave


Majority supports Republicans:

- Divided when by a new payroll tax
- Majority opposes when no specified funding

Paid Family & Medical Leave with Payroll Tax

FAMILIES & CHILDREN

All workers would be allowed to take up to 12 weeks of family or medical leave. Workers on leave would receive from the Federal government, 2/3 of their earnings, up to a maximum of \$4,000 a month. This proposal would be funded by a new 0.62% payroll tax split between employers and employees.



Paid Family & Medical Leave

FAMILIES & CHILDREN

All workers would be allowed to take up to 12 weeks of family or medical leave. Workers on leave would receive from the Federal government, 2/3 of their earnings, up to a maximum of \$4,000 a month. The proposal is estimated to cost around \$23 billion/year.



FAMILIES & CHILDREN

PROPOSAL & SUMMARY

Subsidize child care

- free for low-income parents
- middle-income families pay no more than 7% of income

Majority supports


Republicans:

- standard polling, plurality in favor;
- when briefed, evaluate pro/con arguments, majority opposes

Child Care Assistance

FAMILIES & CHILDREN

The federal government would provide funds to states that want it, to help parents cover some of the cost of childcare, so that low-income families do not pay for child care and middle-income families spend no more than 7% of their income

FAMILIES & CHILDREN

PROPOSAL & SUMMARY


Extend the additional summer SNAP benefits, of about \$130/month, provided to low-income families with children.

Majority supports making permanent;
Majority of Republicans oppose

Childhood Nutrition Assistance

FAMILIES & CHILDREN

Make permanent, during the summer months, up to \$130/month worth of food to very low-income families with school-age children or children under age 6. This proposal would cost around \$2.5 billion year.




Fund the renovation and creation of new public housing; provide additional rental assistance.

Majority supports, and slight majority or plurality of Republicans

Increased Housing Options for Low-Income Americans

Include funding to increase housing options for low-income households in Biden administration's infrastructure plan


EDUCATION

PROPOSAL & SUMMARY

Provide funding to renovate and build new public K-12 schools.

Bipartisan majority supports

\$100 billion to build and improve public schools, as part of President Biden's infrastructure plan

PROPOSAL & SUMMARY


Increase the size of the Pell Grant – higher education aid for low-income students.

Bipartisan majority supports


Increase Pell Grants

EDUCATION

Increase the amount of the Pell Grant, so the maximum amount would increase from around \$6,500 to around \$8,300 a year. This proposal is estimated to cost around \$8.5 billion/year.


Provide free preschool programs to all 3- and 4- year-olds.

A majority supports. Republican views vary; between plurality in favor, plurality opposed

Free Universal Preschool

EDUCATION

Include free universal preschool for all 3- and 4- year-olds in the Biden administration's \$1.8 trillion economic spending plan.




Provide two years of tuition-free community college.


Majority supports; Less than half of Republicans

Free Community College

EDUCATION

States that want to have tuition-free community college could apply for a federal government grant. The federal government would then supplement state spending in order to make community college tuition free for students. This proposal is estimated to cost around \$11 billion/year.


Provide tuition assistance to students attending minority-serving higher education institutions.

Majorities or pluralities support; Majority of Republicans oppose

Tuition Assistance for Minority-Serving Higher Education

EDUCATION

Include funding to provide two years of subsidized tuition for low- and middle- income students enrolled in minority-serving universities/colleges, in the Biden administration's \$1.8 trillion economic spending plan.

IMMIGRATION

PROPOSAL & SUMMARY


Create a new long-term visa with path to citizenship;
For undocumented immigrants:
if clean criminal record, been in US for some time,
and pay taxes they owe.

Bipartisan majority supports; Republicans if the requirements specified

Path to Citizenship

IMMIGRATION

Create a new long-term visa with a potential for permanent residency and then citizenship after several years for undocumented immigrants who have a clean criminal record, have been in the US for some time, and have paid back any taxes they owe.

PROPOSAL & SUMMARY


Increase funding for workforce development and job training in high-demand sectors.

Large bipartisan majorities support, specifically for cybersecurity and the energy industry


Expand the Registered Apprenticeship program.

Large bipartisan majority supports

Tax Credits for Apprenticeship Programs

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Encourage employers to offer more extensive apprenticeship programs by offering them a tax credit up to \$5,000 for each new apprentice


Raise the corporate tax rate to 28 percent.

Large majority supports
Republican views are roughly divided


Raise income and capital gains tax rates on those earning over \$400,000.

Large majority supports
Republicans agree wealthy should pay more,
but support varies depending on context

The wealthiest Americans should pay higher taxes.



Taxing High Incomes for Infrastructure Improvements

TAXES

Raise taxes on households making more than \$400,000 a year to pay for <u>infrastructure</u> improvements



Taxes on Income \$200K - \$500K

TAXES

Raise tax rates for income \$200,000 to \$500,000 back to the level they were before the 2017 tax reforms, generating \$55 billion (budget exercise with deficit)



Taxes on Capital Gains & Dividends

TAXES

Raise taxes on capital gains and dividends by treating them as ordinary income, for income above \$1 million, generating \$90 billion (budget exercise with deficit)

TAXES

PROPOSAL & SUMMARY

Increase the IRS' tax enforcement, particularly on those making over \$400,000.

Large majority supports
Slight majority of Republicans oppose


Increase IRS Enforcement Budget

TAXES

Increase, by \$8 billion a year, the IRS' budget to help close the tax gap, by:

- increasing tax enforcement on very high-income individuals (income over \$400,000)
- updating the technology used to detect tax evasion
- requiring banks and other financial companies to help the IRS verify tax filers' information

It is estimated that this proposal would raise an extra \$70 billion a year in revenue.





Increase IRS Enforcement Budget

Support Among Republicans

Increase, by \$8 billion a year, the IRS' budget to help close the tax gap, by:

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- updating the technology used to detect tax evasion
- requiring banks & other financial companies help IRS verify tax filers' information
